We are still working and involved with the Bonham Animal and Wildlife Sanctuary on a project entitled "Trout in the Bonham". We were able to work with a group of students who helped plant new vegetation throughout the project. Our Fall Fest fundraiser was held on the Bonham property and many of our guests commented on the beauty of the land. We are very excited to be a part of this project.

Two things stand out for the

In early September of 2015 we received 8,000 frout fingerlings that averaged about 7 inches in size. Because of the mild winter we were able to feed them almost daily. By early March the trout had reached an average size of 10 inches with a few over 11 inches. With no weather problems to inhibit the stocking of our trout, everything went smoothly from March thru May.

Holdover trout were kept to be stocked in September. For those not familiar with the term "holdover", it means not all trout are stocked by mid-May. Instead we keep some of the trout, which are fed through the summer, and then stocked in September. Average sizes of the trout Your sponsorship is absolutely

Second, because of the extreme heat, salt was put in the raceway on a daily basis from mid-July until mid-Sept. Again, the cost of salt was \$600 over budget. Our budget is stable and we were

Her diligence paid off. As of Nov. 7 several fry have already hatched successfully. We are planning a "release day" with her students this spring where the raised brook trout fry will be released into our watershed.


