## COOP NURSERY REPORT

All spring trout stocking has been completed as of May 4, 2017. A total of 7800 trout have been stocked. Because of low mortality this winter and the state giving us a few extra trout, there will be approximately 650 holdovers stocked in be the to fall. Dates for stocking the trout will be announced in early September. In addition there were 3 dozen holdovers from last fall that have not been stocked yet. They are about 20 inches long and weigh close to 4 pounds. They will be stocked with the other holdovers this fall. All of this is possible because of the financial and volunteer support we receive to raise the trout.

Grants have been received from the state and the county to renovate our nursery. This will include: new stainless steel fixtures; new lids and wiring for the raceway; new screen inserts to be used in the raceway; and new plywood each end of the for raceway. A new door will also be installed at the upper Workdays will be end. scheduled in June/July to complete the renovations. Help will be needed. Anyone willing to help is asked to contact Fred Wilt as soon as possible at 717-309-8098. That way, crews, equipment, etc. can be prepared to do the work.

Again, a big thank you goes out to the feeders, who daily feed and check the conditions of the trout. And a huge "thank you" to all the helpers and stockers on the day trout are stocked!

We will be conducting our annual picnic in recognition of the landowners in the Muddy Creek Watershed. This year's event will be held at the Bonham Wake-Robin Wildlife Sanctuary, 101 Spencer Road, off Kennedy Road, Airville PA, 17302 from 11 am – 3 pm on Saturday, October 14. Last year's event generated more than \$1,500 toward our Trout in the Classroom Project at Ore Valley Elementary School in the Dallastown Area School District. If we are successful in our fundraising efforts this year, we hope to expand the TIC program to the Red Lion Area Junior High School this fall.

## TROUT AT THE BONHAM REPORT

The chapter is continuing its grant work in partnership York with the County Conservation Society to bring brown trout back to Spencer Run. The chapter is providing signage for the Bonham-Wake Robin Wildlife Sanctuary so that future school field trips and visitors to the property are able to see points of interest such as Riparian

Buffer improvement on Spencer Run, The trout egg incubator site and the woodland pond. As part of our grant work, we plan in the future to build a new bridge at the property and in stream engage restoration work on Spencer Run which is a tributary to Muddy Creek just above Bridgeton. The property can be accessed via a gravel road off of Kennedy Road and in addition to the Education Center, offers several miles of woodland and meadow trails. A special thanks to Chris Haag for his sign design work as we finish up that part of the project. The target date for sign installation is June/July 2017.

## Trout in the Classroom - Field Day

April 8 was the culmination of our partnership with the third grade students from Valley Elementary Ore School with "Release Day" activities. The Chapter assisted in the planning and release of approximately 70 brook trout fry into Spencer Run on the Bonham Wake-Robin Wildlife Sanctuary. Each student got to release a trout with the help of their teacher, Mrs. Alisha Good.

The students then also did a macro-invertebrate study in Spencer run, turning rocks and collecting macros: Mayfly nymphs, caddis larvae, midge larvae along with salamanders and crawfish were found. Each student got to plant a tree or shrub stream side to enhance the riparian buffer. The Chapter purchased these plants with money the students raised at their school "trout store" and donated to our chapter.

After the stream side activities we treated all to a cookout. Fly fishing and casting demos were provided to anyone that was interested. 35 students participated along with their parents and families. Attendance was in excess of 100 people. 15 chapter and Coop sponsors helped stream side, prepare and cook, gave fly fishing/ casting demos and transport the fry from the school to the site. Many thanks to all who helped!
